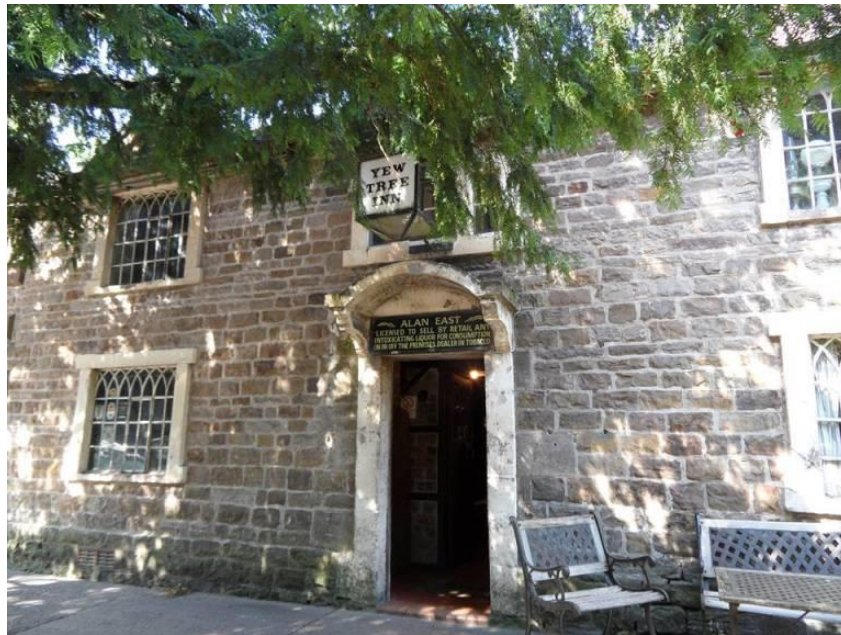


Our next meeting is on Sunday October 4th and is a visit to the Yew Tree in Cauldon.



“The Yew Tree at Cauldon is an Aladdin’s Cave featuring a unique collection of antiques and curios including Queen Victoria’s Stockings, a 3,000-year-old Grecian urn, penny farthings, the Acme Dog Carrier and various musical instruments including one named *the Serpent*. Sit on antique benches, settees & settles”.

The real ale is cheap, there are delicious pork pies, other pies and pasties or sandwiches for lunch – what more could you want? We will be there from noon onwards.

The Yew Tree at Cauldon is 4.5 miles from Froghall Canal Basin on the beautiful Cauldon Canal, 5 Miles from Alton Towers, 7.5 Miles from The Churnet Valley Railway at Cheddleton, 8 Miles from Leek & Ashbourne, 13 Miles from Stoke-on-Trent. Cauldon is one mile from Waterhouses which lies between Leek and Ashbourne on the A523 – when you get to Waterhouses just follow the sign. The Yew Tree Inn lies on the right hand side of the road. The postcode is **ST10 3EJ**.
