

Be Eternally Vigilant

Extracted from FBHVC newsletter, March 2000.

In his opening statement to the annual conference of the Federation of British Historic Vehicle Clubs (FBHVC), which represents over 250,000 historic vehicle owners belonging to some 300 clubs, its President Lord Montagu of Beaulieu recalled that this year the Veteran Car Club was holding a rally to celebrate the centenary of the 1900 'Thousand Miles Trial', which really introduced the new-fangled motor car to the British public. "Cars were reviled and hated then," he remarked, "and they are still reviled and hated by vociferous special interest groups after a hundred years. It's essential that the historic vehicle movement remains eternally vigilant!".

Delegates were keenly awaiting the presentation by the next speaker, Jonathan Turner of Bayford Thrust, one of the largest independent energy companies in the UK. His company is the front runner in supplying leaded petrol, holding over 80 per cent of the nationwide allocation (West Country Thrust Franchise Distributor BWOC Ltd was awarded almost 10 per cent in addition, giving Bayford Thrust 90 per cent of the market).

His ambition is to have a distributor in every large town and maybe two or three in major cities. Though the licence to sell leaded petrol was initially allocated only for one year, Mr Turner has been encouraged by recent discussions with the DETR, which implied that there was no obstacle to leaded petrol being available "for ever".

Air Cut

Extracted from the Honest John column in The Daily Telegraph, 25 March, 2000.

An interesting story in Feb 12 edition of New Scientist reported that new cars cause more pollution than old, partly through "specification creep". I deplore the vitually universal fitting of power steering, even on small cars that don't need it, because this inevitably absorbs power and leads to more pollution. **A.K., Oxford**

The National Institute of Public Health and the Environment at Utrecht University in Holland has produced figures which show that building a new car and recycling an old one creates more CO₂ than continuing to run the old car. This is compounded by the "specification creep" of which A.K. writes. The Institute's figures show that by reducing the average age of cars in the Netherlands by three years would actually increase CO₂ emissions by four per cent overall, although the effect would be lessened if people replaced large, inefficient old cars with small, efficient new ones. J.T. of Standlake adds that, during a 10-12 year lifespan, the average car will never use as much energy as was taken to build it.

Stop Press

The following article allegedly appeared in "Le Monde", Monday 21 February 2000.

Paris - Saturday 19 Feb. Scots Target Retromobile.

Unconfirmed reports claim a small group of renegade Scots Tractionists have infiltrated Frances' premier classic car event. Suspicious characters, with very doubtful accents, have been spotted in and around the Porte de Versailles at the 25th Retromobile exhibition. The group, all believed to come from Perthshire, was seen thumbing catalogues around Citroën spare parts stands. They could be identified by their excited gibbering and frantic pointing. Police report that the group was good natured; there were few arrests.

The tyres thumped over the joints in the concrete taxiway as we rolled forward out of the hanger and down towards the broad tarmac strip. Somewhere east of Leicester on a spring morning, traces of mist still hanging in the fields, birds scattering at the sound of our approach as the navigator called out the final checks "maps, picnic hamper, corkscrew". Then "choke away" as the engine note rose and with only a hint of clutch judder we shook off the ties of home and headed for our rendezvous point.

At precisely 0830hrs, or around half past nine anyway we joined a holding pattern of TOC Mid-Shires members circling the village green at Great Glen. There we opened our sealed orders and, with F Frankie and pilot Martin "Eddie the Eagle" Edwards leading the way, set our course, code named Amber Six, towards Market Harborough. The engine droned steadily now as we settled into the routine, would this be just another 'milk run' or would there be excitement waiting at the end of our journey? Our

wing tips almost clipping the hedgerows, we banked round the Little Chef at Kettering and headed south towards Bedford.

As we sighted the airship hangers at Cardington, we came upon "Big Bill" Wyman, a pathfinder from the South Midlands group, and made our final run in to the target together.

Situated a few miles south of Bedford, Old Warden Airfield is home to the Shuttleworth Collection of historic aircraft. Created by Richard Shuttleworth in the early 1930's it is one of the few all grass aerodromes still in use. Richard learned to fly in 1932 and subsequently started the collection that now numbers 40 aircraft, many of them the last surviving examples of their type. Killed in a night flying accident in 1940, Richard's memory is kept alive by the Trust established by his mother.

On May 7th, sixty years on, Veteran Aeroplane Society members staged a special air show to commemorate the Battle of France. What could be better then than a sprinkling of Tractions on the ground to add a little atmosphere? We were joined at the field by other South

Midlands members including "tail end Charlie" Jonathan Marten-Hale; but then he lives just round the corner so was bound to arrive last!

As the Mainline Big Band struck up in hanger 3 the first drops of rain fell. By the time they reached the vocals in 'Wrap Your Troubles in Dreams' it was a steady downpour! Had those met office johnnies got it wrong yet again? Never mind the White Cliffs of Dover, what about some blue sky here. Just as all seemed lost the cloud and our spirits lifted, the sun and the picnic tables came out and the flying display commenced.

Gloster Gladiator, Hawker Hind and Tiger Moth, Bucker Jungmann and Avro Tutor training aircraft, Mk II Hurricanes, Austers and Westland Lysanders the list was almost endless.

The scene was set, by commentator Mark Whall, at an airfield "somewhere in Northern France" in the spring of 1940. A British Army unit was encamped on the perimeter of the field to defend it from the German advance as Hurricanes were scrambled to support the Expeditionary Force on the battlefield. Then the airfield itself came under attack and finally fell to the invading army. As the remnants of the army unit were marched away the RAF Hurricane squadrons returned to England to fight another day.

All in all a superb display, a splendid afternoon, a chance to show off our Tractions, and an opportunity to meet some dedicated aeronautical enthusiasts.



Two go to Belgium

Belgische Oude Citroën Club rally, 1/2 April 2000

The BOCC rally at Wenduine (1/2 April) was very well attended. Wenduine is on the coast just north-east of Oostende and near to Blankenberge. The weather was fine, but the wind cold.

About 60-70 cars assembled on Saturday morning on the Rotonde (a circular concourse on the sea front). They were mostly Tractions, but with quite a few DS and some older models. Eric Vandamme's 1919 Type A was much admired, and an absolutely immaculate C6. Then we drove in convoy to the Atlantic Wall, using minor roads and carefully circumnavigating Oostende. That evening there was a cheese and wine party for about 100. The Elvis cabaret was quite a surprise, particularly it seemed for Jan Van Hecke.

On the Sunday morning groups of cars met at different start points for 5 trajects (sort of treasure hunts in convoys). We had chosen a route through the polders past 4 torrens plattes (towers that had had beacons on their flat roofs when the sea was much further inland). For about 30 miles we wound our way along tiny lanes, many of them cobbled. Across the canals and fields you could see the chain of Tractions progressing in great style. We particularly liked the picturesque villages of Sint Anna ter Muiden (which we almost missed) and Damme. The 2 cars which most stood out in our group were Walter & Noëlla Callens' 1934 7B (the oldest Traction in Belgium) and the beautiful Slough Big 15 Roadster (ex Fred Annells).

Back in Wenduine some cars not on the trajets were already gathering on the Rotonde, and by lunch-time there were some 70-80 cars neatly lined up. An excellent lunch was taken by 128, and the afternoon ended with a reception kindly given by the commune. We were made very welcome throughout the weekend, and extend our thanks and congratulations for an extremely well organised event.



Four Star Petrol News

By Geoff Smith, Chairman FBHVC, Jonathan Turner (Bayford Thrust) and James Milne (Futura)

Following the Federation's success in persuading the Government to approve the 0.5 per cent leaded petrol share of sales permitted under EU legislation, the number of garages stocking the fuel is increasing every week.

There appear to be two major holdups in completing a national network: some major fuel companies will not allow their frachisees to stock leaded fuel, while many garages that have agreed to take leaded are finding it difficult to empty their tanks of LRP!

It is unfortunate that in the three months since leaded petrol again became available that petrol prices have been raised due to increased crude oil prices and even higher taxation imposed on motor fuel in the Budget.

The lion's share of the leaded permit allocation has been taken up by Bayford Thrust and its Franchise Distributor BWOC.

The good news is that there are already over 100 sites retailing leaded four star. The legalities were easier than the realities. Response from historic vehicle owners has been huge and as a result many more filling stations hope to be selling leaded petrol in the near future.

Bayford Thrust have been talking to the oil companies, as many of the sites have supply contracts in place. Permission has already been granted on selected sites by such major brands as TotalFina, Jet, Texaco and Q8, plus some smaller brands like UK, Power and National.

The logistics have been another obstacle, as the fuel is currently sourced from the Thames. Bayford Thrust are hopeful of achieving their target of nationwide coverage, although until the network builds to a sensible level this is proving difficult. Sometimes filling stations requiring deliveries may be as much as 200 miles from each other! In most cases they are also ordering quantities of 4000 litres when the normal load size would be 32,000 litres.

Bayford Thrust's web site is receiving regular hits (over 1000 last week!) and they are getting about 100 emails a week, plus countless phone calls from owners of classics wanting to know where their nearest site is. Bayford Thrust are convinced that local car clubs and classic car enthusiasts asking their local filling station to stock leaded petrol is working! So get out and knock on some doors and tell your petrol retailer to contact Bayford Thrust on 01937 541111 or www.bayfordthrust.co.uk


Futura Petroleum has joined Bayford Thrust and BWOC in joint enterprises to supply leaded petrol under the DETR permit scheme to meet the needs of classic car owners whose vehicles cannot satisfactorily run on unleaded plus additives or lead replacement petrol.

Futura is an operating subsidiary of Forum Oil and Gas OY -Finland's premier energy group. Operating in the UK for over five years, it has its own gasoline blending plant on the Thames where its leaded petrol is manufactured.

Whilst Futura has been at the forefront of introducing cleaner automotive fuel to the UK, the company has long expressed a commitment to the DETR to produce leaded fuel to meet the needs of minority interest groups.

In respect of lead content and octane numbers, Futura leaded petrol meets the requirements of the old BS4040 Four Star specification, but is more environmentally friendly. All petrol now sold in the UK has to meet Year 2000 EU requirements, so that levels of sulphur, aromatics, benzines and olefins are reduced from those allowed under the old specification.

The Futura company states; "Note that the derogation from the EU to limit leaded sales to 0.5% of the overall petrol consumption is indefinite, as is the DETR's permit scheme. At predicted levels of consumption, Furtura is committed to maintaining manufacture, supply and distribution, so that classic owners should have no doubt about our, and our distribution partners', long-term objective of keeping leaded petrol available on forecourts".




